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EXCEL 9 - EXCEL House, Anchorage December 2017



PLCPs \* Career Exploration \* Pre-employment Skills

Completing our *second* EXCEL 9 session for the year, we are delighted to tell you how much the students accomplished! EXCEL 9 sessions are designed to introduce students to various career pathways through interactive field trips and job tours. They practice valuable employability skills, including, but not limited to timemanagement, teamwork, and critical thinking. In this session students start their Personal Learning & Career Plan (PLCP) on the Alaska Career Information System (AKCIS). As part of Mini-career workshop, students learn pre-employment skills as they start practicing are how to fill out a job application, resume and cover letter writing,



as well as taking a look at their own work values and how important it is to find a well-fitting career.

In this session students successfully completed: Drug and alcohol prevention training Healthy lifestyle lessons; the importance of drinking water Proper use of social media Educational tours of the Alaska Zoo and the Alaska Crime Lab Service learning project; created beaded bracelets for elders at South Central Foundation AKCIS profiles Mock job application, resume, and cover letter Lessons in personal social skills, i.e. hand shakes, active listening





### Mini Bridging Session, AVTEC in Seward November/December

#### Intro to AVTEC's training programs

Seventeen students from nine different western Alaska villages attend the 2017 EXCEL Alaska AVTEC Mini-Bridging session. While at AVTEC, students had the opportunity to take The Adult Basic Education (TABE) exam, as well as participate in a variety of AVTEC trade classrooms.

They had invitations to spend their days in:

- Culinary Arts
- Maritime
- Industrial Electricity
- Plumbing and Heating
- Combination Welding
- Diesel Heavy Equipment Technologies
- Business Office Technology

Evenings found them working on career development strategies. Somewhere, in this crazy schedule, they also found a little



opportunity for leisure time and a daily workout. At the start of the session only two students had an idea of what they wanted to do after high school, however, by the end of the Mini-bridging Camp, 12 students said they would like to attend AVTEC to become successful in their future careers.

### Healthy Lifestyles \* Driver's Licenses \* Independent Living Skills



Just last week, 17 students were at the EXCEL House in Anchorage for some specialized training, curriculum designed for young adults gearing up to experience supporting themselves. In the ten short days they were here, though short might be debatable if you talk to the students! They were up very early to participate in what their day held and were still up late to make sure they completed homework assignments sent from their home schools. With individual wants and needs in mind, lessons were tailored to suit each student's "after high school" plan and the next steps for accomplishment.

EXCEL 12 activities are designed to also push students outside their comfort zones and to teach them to effectively communicate with adults and peers in business environments. Some of the highlights:

- Completed Healthy Lifestyles lesson; balanced diets
- Preparing meals, including planning meals and shopping for food
- Received either Alaska State Driver's permits or licenses
- Researched local jobs for which they were qualified, prepared resumes and cover letters, completed mock-interviews\*
- Campus tours
  - Alaska Job Corps
  - AVTEC
  - Kenai Peninsula College
  - University of Alaska Anchorage
  - GCI
- Personal finance presentation\*\*
- Opened savings or checking accounts\*\*\*
- Started scholarship essay
- Completed college budget sheets for college costs
- Completed Accuplacer test for University of Alaska placement
- Budgeting activity (including salary, housing, transportation)
- Completed TABE test for AVTEC
